### *Ponderings*

A few years ago, our then 2-year-old son squirmed and couldn't sit still in the theater beyond the 15 minute mark of the popular kids movie "Frozen". He frustrated his mother and me with his refusal to sit and watch the movie, and we ended up leaving the movie before it was even halfway done.

Later on, as the soundtrack for that movie started dominating the radio waves, I kept hearing "Let It Go" and, against my wishes, would regularly get the song stuck in my head. That song came back to me recently as I prepared for a sermon about letting go of our fears, envy, and need to have things figured out all the time. I resisted the urge to sing the song in the sermon, and you were all spared the experience of hearing me sing a song from a Disney movie.

I think more and more that one of the reasons the song became so popular was that it contained a message that we all either desperately need to hear or desperately want to hear. I confess that I'm a little conflicted about this. It all depends on what context we're talking about letting something go.

For instance, I once briefly counseled a woman who was being abused by her domestic partner. No way was I going to say, "let it go". There are times when things ought to be dealt with and cannot simply be let go. So there are some instances where our desire to "let it go" can lead to further pain and should not be followed.

However, there are many times when we really are carrying unnecessary baggage. We carry bitterness, we hold onto grudges, and we needlessly compare ourselves to others.

In those moments, Jesus comes to us with a radical message: "LET IT GO."

How can Jesus ask something so difficult of us? He can ask it because he knows it's best for us. He can ask it because he accepts us as we are.

So let go of what is not yours to carry. We can stop chasing after what our neighbors have, because we have something more important and meaningful: we have the unconditional love of our Creator. It is indeed our duty and our joy to praise and thank a God who so radically loves us and embraces us right where we are.

## Council Meeting Minutes—August 13, 2018

**Present Council Members:** Pastor Hecox, Dave Phillips, Lynn Christian, Phil Keller, Diane Carr, Debbie Robertson, Joshua Wilkes

**Opening Devotions:** Dave opened with prayer & Lynn opened with devotions.

### Minutes of July Council Meeting

Minutes reviewed from previous Council Meeting. Dave motioned to accept, Josh second. All in favor.

**Treasurer's report:** Treasurers report reviewed. Lynn motioned to accept, Josh second. All in favor. Diane motioned to move money left over from air conditioning fund (\$2948.82) to the boiler fund. Debbie second, All in favor. Lynn motioned to investigate the possibility of taking a loan from Synod at 0% interest to pay for the balance due on the boiler at the end of August. If a loan is not feasible, then money from MIF fund would be used to pay for the balance due on the boiler with the condition that money be replaced by donations designated for the boiler fund following the installation. Josh second, All in favor. Dave will investigate the loan option.

**Old Business:** Dave and Pastor Hecox will be meeting with the Mary Kay and Preschool Representatives on August 20<sup>th</sup> to review pre-school finances and discuss how Grace and the Preschool can mutually support the Grace mission.

### Pastors Report

Pastor provided his monthly report. He is averaging 6 visits weekly since coming to Grace. Pastor also provided the following updates:

Gathering Day September 9<sup>th</sup> - Service will be held inside with communion and meal being held outdoors. Grace Members will be asked to sign up to bring a dish to pass.

Programs- Pastor is working to organize the following education programs:

- Evening Bible Study-TBD
- Confirmation-TBD

Pastor was approached by Steve Francis. There continues to be interest from the community in leasing some of Grace's property to build a handi-cap accessible park. The council will provide questions of concern regarding the proposal to Pastor Seth who will forward these questions to Mr. Francis. Mr. Francis will then meet with the church council to discuss this topic in greater detail.

Pastor continues to work on creating Grace Teams and what responsibilities would fall under these teams.

### Committee Report

*Properties-* Debbie Robertson presented the properties report. Lynn motioned to accept, Josh second. All in favor.

*Youth-* Josh stated that youth and confirmation will be taking the Boundary Waters Trip in 2019 from July 28<sup>th</sup> to August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Parents will help with costs, along with fundraising.

Discussion regarding creating a Community Raised Garden took place. The topic was tabled for a later date.

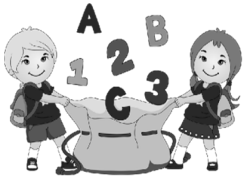
Next Council Meeting- September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2018. Josh will provide the September 2<sup>nd</sup> Devotion.
