Then, he grows up in the small, no where town of Nazareth. Nothing ever happens in Nazareth. No one really cares about Nazareth. He grows up in the little place, the out of the way, side streets and towns that the really powerful and important people pass by. He is like a toy god that is used for a while then trashed (crucified) and thrown in a dump.

If that is where it all stops—in a dump, then what do you make of Easter. Is it all just a children's story? Or, perhaps just wishful thinking? But, imagine for a moment that the big huffing, puffing tank engine god becomes the small, on the bedroom floor god. He gets down on hands and knees to be with you where you live each day. He comes to you in the ordinary dreams and disappointments, joys and sorrows. He comes to you with all your faults and flaws as well as strengths and successes to simply say "I love you". Maybe faith is not a play thing, but the real life changing encounter with one who is truly God. And, if you should call him Thomas, that's okay too.
